

Why Camp?

Summer camp provides youth with a safe place to try new things, “miss the mark” and try again. The people and the environment intentionally fostered at camp allow campers to have that moment when frustration or failure set in, and then with guidance, they make the decision to carry on. This decision can result in making them more resilient.



Ultimately, campers can learn to find a way to respond to setbacks positively. Michael Brandwein, noted speaker and consultant to the camp profession, spoke about the benefits of camp. *“What makes camp a special community is its focus on celebrating effort,”* he said. *“In this less pressured atmosphere, children learn more readily what positive things to say and do when they make mistakes and face challenges.”* Brandwein added, *“The traditions and customs of each different camp are like a secret code that allows those who know it to feel embraced by something unique and special.”*

Without the rigor of an academic curriculum, camp can focus on teaching social skills. Brandwein speaks more about the unique concepts focused on at summer camp. *“Campers are urged to include, not exclude, others,”* he noted.

“They are praised for choosing new partners and not always the same ones. They are encouraged to respect the differences between people. In an increasingly sarcastic, put-down-oriented world, camps aim to be an oasis of personal safety where demeaning comments and disrespectful behavior are not tolerated and children are taught responsible and positive ways to resolve conflicts.”

If you're looking for a camp featuring lots of FUN FOR 4-YEAR-OLDS, our Camp WONDEROO is for you.

CAMP WONDEROO is the perfect way to introduce your child to the day camp experience. We limit enrollment so that we meet a 1:5 counselor-to-camper ratio. The "Wonderoo Crew" includes Webb Lower School faculty, local teachers and mature, college-age students. Campers explore the world during a week filled with a rotating schedule of activities appropriate for 4-year-olds.

The best part of Wonderoo is the sense of joy that comes naturally when the staff interact with their Wonderoo campers. Don't miss out on having your child experience the fun and love of Wonderoo!

TO BE A WONDEROO: Campers must be 4 years old by the beginning of their camp week. They should not be entering kindergarten. All children must be fully toilet-trained. We realize that accidents do occur and we are prepared to respond in a compassionate and reassuring manner. However, if these accidents occur more than once a week, the child will not be able to continue to attend camp.

CAMP WONDEROO offers a whole slew of things for you to do! Pack your bags, put on your cape and off we go for an adventure-filled week of wonder and whooping it up, Camp Webb style!

Summer is a time when children can enjoy the fun of being a kid. Camp Webb's Adventure Camp offers a safe, fun and structured program in which campers make friends, develop life skills, experience teamwork, and just learn to have a great time being themselves.

How it works

Boys and girls, entering kindergarten through 7th grade, are put into groups according to the grade they will be entering the upcoming school year. These groups rotate through a variety of activities during the day.

ADVENTURE CAMP

ROPES COURSE

Our state-of-the-art ropes course provides low and high rope challenges in a beautiful, wooded setting. Campers of all ages can take on the “Vertical Playpen” on the climbing tower and swing on our giant “Swingshot” while building their teamwork skills and confidence.

NATURE DISCOVERY

Campers explore global and local ecology through crafts, hikes, turtles, frogs, bugs, and slugs. Fort building in the woods is a favorite as well!

ARCHERY

There’s nothing like hitting the ol’ bullseye! Our instructor teaches both beginners and more experienced archers the safety and sport of archery.



ARTS & CRAFTS

Creative expression in our fully-equipped art studio is a great way to cool off during an action-packed day. Led by our arts and crafts counselor, campers make everything from melted crayon paintings to footprint fish.

DRAMA

Under the direction of our experienced drama counselor, campers learn and enjoy improvisation, theater games, storytelling, and for older groups, skit production.

SPORTS & GAMES

Children find it irresistible to run around and be part of a team. Here they can participate in various sports and games like Capture the Flag, SPUD and even Quidditch! Games and activities are age-appropriate, of course.

SWIMMING

You can’t have summer without cooling off in the pool! Your child is briefly evaluated and then can enjoy recreational swimming time.

KID’S CHOICE (Electives)

Campers choose from a number of activities, such as Scatter Ball (a Camp Webb original), parachute games or jewelry making. Activities vary week-to-week according to the theme.

THEME WEEKS

To add to the excitement, the staff creates a theme for each week, ranging from Banana Week to our annual Adventure Cup Week. Campers participate in themed activities and are encouraged to join in the fun by dressing up according to the theme. Our activity counselors incorporate the themes into the usual daily activities. For example, during Banana Week in sports and games, we launch bananas using a giant slingshot!

ADVENTURE CAMP



When parents enroll their child in Camp Webb, they are entrusting us with their most prized possession. We at Camp Webb take that responsibility very seriously by hiring the best people we can find.

Counselors are chosen based on their maturity, ability to be positive role models, experience with children, and level of enthusiasm. It is essential that the camp counselors we hire understand the important balance between creating a super-fun experience for our campers and keeping them safe. It is the staff that brings life to a camp, not the facilities, food or sports equipment. The positive connections made between Camp Webb staff and campers are what makes the experience here both distinctive and valuable.

Our senior counselors must be at least 18 years of age and have passed a screening and interview process. All staff members at Camp Webb participate in orientation and training programs prior to campers' arrival. We limit our Adventure Camp enrollment to an overall 1:4 staff-to-camper ratio.

It is a symbiotic relationship between counselor and camper, where the camper gets assistance in maturation and cooperation, and the counselor gets to absorb some of the kid's natural energy. Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Program

Many of our older Adventure Camp campers look up to our senior staff and are interested in training to become leaders at Camp Webb. The summer after their 7th grade year, campers may apply for the Counselor-In-Training (CIT) Program. If accepted, a CIT will train for 1 or 2 weeks with a senior counselor in a camper group.

Counselors-In-Training assist senior counselors with guiding a group or managing an activity. This is an opportunity to develop independence, learn responsibility for others and practice strong leadership skills. After successfully completing the first year of the program, CITs may apply to assume additional responsibilities as Junior Counselors (JC) the following year. Counselors-In-Training work a maximum of 2 weeks (but may apply for more). Junior Counselors may work up to 4 weeks.

Please have your potential CIT/JC visit the Volunteering page at campwebb.com for more information on the Counselor-In-Training experience.

1) Parents will need to apply on the Camper Application for the desired CIT weeks of the summer, beginning the first day of camper registration. Please indicate the number of weeks available. If accepted, we will use your options to schedule your CIT/JC for a week or two of fun.

2) The potential CIT will then be able to view and complete the online application. In order to do so, log in to your CampMinder account and navigate to the Forms and Documents page to locate and complete the CIT Overview and Application. This application process begins at the same time as camper registration.





REGISTRATION & POLICIES

EXTENDED CAMP DAY OPTIONS

Earlycare: Campers may be dropped off at camp, starting at 7:30. There is no fee for morning supervision. Campers and staff may enjoy a game of Ga-Ga or 4 Square, or sometimes an UNO tournament breaks out! At 8:30, campers will be escorted to their camp's drop-off location.

Aftercare: Campers who cannot be picked up at the end of their camps may stay for extended supervision for an additional charge. At Camp Webb's Aftercare, children can form new friendships and strengthen old ones during structured downtime. Aftercare provides a variety of choices for campers during their afternoon time. Socializing on the playground, participating in sports activities in the gym or on the basketball courts, or getting creative with various craft projects are some of the many things available to campers. Aftercare is offered on a weekly or daily basis. The hours are from 2:15 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Campers must be entering kindergarten-8th grade. **Cost:** Daily – \$20 or Weekly – \$50 (three days or more). You may sign your camper up for Aftercare at the time of registration or on the day you need it. **Location:** Haslam Center. *Note: We cannot prorate nor can we give refunds with this program.*

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

T-Shirt: Each camper will receive one free T-shirt per summer.

Lunch: Tired of getting up every morning and throwing together lunches in a lunch box? We provide lunch and it's included in the cost of all camps! Campers and staff

cool off together inside and enjoy a nutritious, hot lunch. In addition, we are a "nut-aware" camp and work directly with families when children have specific allergies.

Nurse: A nurse is on site and available every day of the Camp Webb season. Our nurse will call you if your camper comes to visit and requires more than minor medical attention. The nurse is here to dispense medication when required, provide top-level health care if needed and TLC all the time! Our ultimate goal is to be proactive and to practice prevention by safeguarding against accidents and illness as much as possible.

Pick-Up Requirement: To speed up the pick-up process without jeopardizing the safety of Camp Webb campers, we require that you or the person you have authorized in our system to pick up your child be prepared to show a picture ID to sign your child out.

"SunSense": Most summers are hot here in East Tennessee; therefore, exposure to the heat and sunlight is something we are constantly monitoring. Please have your child bring a water bottle and sunscreen. Staff will make sure there are frequent water breaks and that sunscreen is applied often (especially for outdoor camps). Campers are in the shade whenever possible on especially hot and humid days.

Footwear: Sturdy shoes are especially important, as campers will be active during the day. Flip-flops, Crocs and open-toed shoes are **strongly discouraged**. Please wear sneakers.



CHANGE POLICY

- Any changes to a camper's schedule **must be made in writing** by sending an email to campwebb@webbschool.org. No phone calls, please.
- A change is defined as switching to another camp within the same week or to a different week of camp.
- If a change is requested between ten (10) and five (5) working days before the first day of the camp, **there is a \$25 change fee.**
- A change made within five (5) working days of the first day of the camp **will incur a \$50 fee.** Please refer to the Fee/Date Schedule. **There are no exceptions.** Notification Email: campwebb@webbschool.org

CANCELLATION-REFUND POLICY

Amount of refund is determined by means and timing of notification.

Means: Requests to cancel a camp **must be made in writing via email. No phone calls or voice mails, please.** Notification Email: campwebb@webbschool.org

Timing: No refunds will be given, nor will the deposit be transferable, if the email request to cancel is received after the cut-off date and/or in a phone call or voice mail. Please refer to the 2019 Fee/Date Schedule for specific dates.

If cancellations are made before the cut-off date and in writing, families have two options:

Option A: Switch to another week of camp and don't lose your deposit! The required deposit is transferable as a deposit to an additional week for a camper within your family, but it can never be applied to a family balance.

Option B: Get a partial refund. A partial refund equal to the cost of the camp minus the \$50 nonrefundable deposit will be issued. The required deposit still may not be applied to a family balance. In order to be fair to all camp families, there are no exceptions to this policy. This is for any reason, including vacation plan changes, sickness or injury.

- If Camp Webb must cancel a camp for any reason, applicants will receive a full refund.
- Refunds will be processed at the end of the summer. There are no refunds for Aftercare, as refunds hinder our ability to staff this service.
